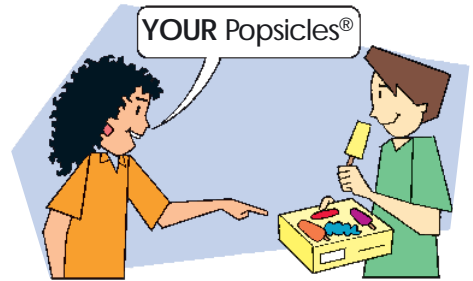
MY + SINGULAR NOUN

MY + PLURAL NOUN



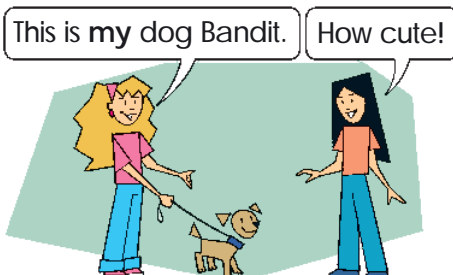
YOUR + PLURAL NOUN

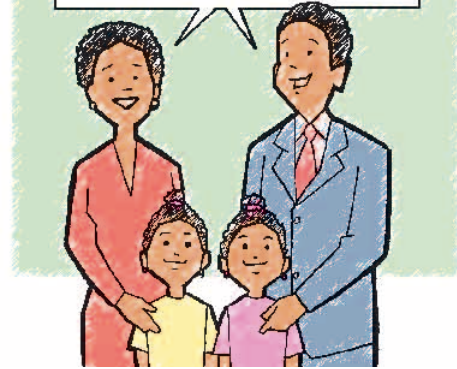


POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVES: *OUR*, *YOUR* (PL.), AND *THEIR*

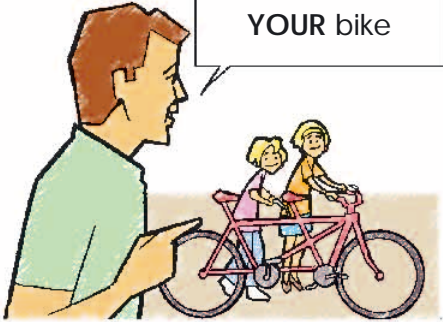
OUR daughter



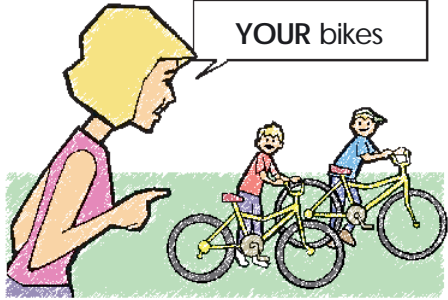
OUR daughters

THEIR bag

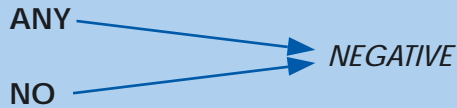

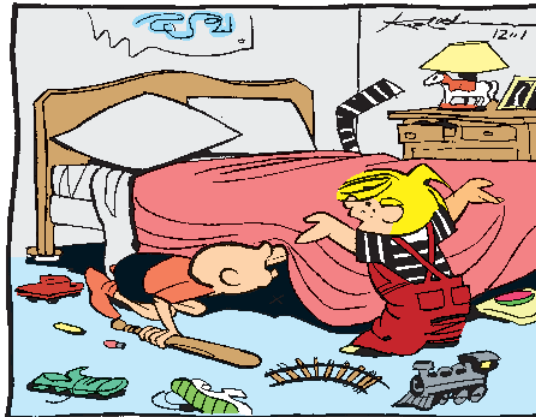
REMEMBER THIS:



- ANY is used when the verb is in the *negative* form.
- NO is used when the verb is in the *affirmative* form.

Now read this *Dennis the Menace* cartoon. Notice that Dennis uses *no* after the affirmative form *there are*.
