

MUST

Look at these examples.

"Look at Steve. It's so early, but he's already going to bed. He **must** be very tired."

"That boy **must** be Tony's son. He looks so much like him."

Now look at this chart. Notice that **must** is used with all persons.

I	must be sick.
You	
He	
She	
It	
We	
You	
They	



The verb that comes after **must** does not take *to*.

Here's another example:

DENNIS THE MENACE

"THERE MUST BE SOMETHIN' WRONG WITH YOUR EARS MR. WILSON... THAT'S THE *THIRD* TIME MY MOM WASN'T CALLIN' ME!"
